BACKGROUND



INTRODUCTION

At CSW 60, the feminist and women's movements have a golden opportunity to rally around this year's priority theme: "Women's empowerment and its link to sustainable development." The Agreed Conclusions from this session will contribute to the UN's 2030 sustainable development goals (SDGs) that were adopted by the General Assembly in 2015. And we should celebrate the SDGs as one of of the most ambitious UN projects since the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Goal Number 5 on gender equality opens the door for women and girls to raise such issues as violence against women and women's sexual and reproductive health rights. While that is a great starting point, the real challenge is to ensure that women and girls also have an equal decision-making role in the other 16 goals. Clearly, we have important contributions to make toward ending poverty and hunger, health and education, decent work and economic growth, clean energy, reducing inequality, sustainable cities, climate action and peace.

Let us remember that way back in 1995 at the UN Fourth World Conference on Women, governments committed to ensuring that gender equality and women's empowerment were central to attaining sustainable development. As paragraph 58 of the Beijing Platform for Action (BPfA) states: "Sustainable development and economic growth that is both sustained and sustainable are possible only through improving the economic, social, political, legal and cultural status of women." Indeed, the BPfA provides a holistic framework that—along with the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination (CEDAW)—can guide us to achieving the SDG goals. Furthermore, ending violence against women and girls, the review theme for CSW 60, is a basic prerequisite to women's full political and economic participation. At this session, let us reaffirm that women's human rights must remain central to the UN's development agenda and that " all issues are women's issues."

2030 AGENDA

Sustainable Development Goals

CEDAW

CEDAW, Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women, was ratified by 188 of 193 UN Member States and adopted in 1979 by the United Nations General Assembly. CEDAW defines discrimination against women and sets an international agenda for action to end such discrimination. The convention addresses the five major tenets of human rights: economic, political, civil, cultural and social rights for women and girls and calls for equal education and equal employment while promoting social benefits including social security, health care, maternity benefits, parental leave and childcare.

CEDAW also defines a structure for nations to report progress in eliminating discrimination against women. It sets up a system of quadrennial national reports from governments to the CSW outlining progress and challenges. Included is an opportunity for organizations outside of government to report national progress through shadow reports.

Historically, treaties define external relationships between nations. CEDAW, and other human rights conventions, however, relate to internal relationships between residents. Many nations have had structural difficulties in translating these rights from central national governments to local authorities that interact daily with the public. This has driven the need for a new paradigm for enforcing human rights at a local level.

Cities for CEDAW is a nationwide, grassroots initiative to encourage local governments in the United States to support gender rights by adopting local ordinances based on the CEDAW framework. Local governments will assess their actions through a gender lens. The public will also have the opportunity to report on the progress of their local governments.

San Francisco enacted CEDAW in 1998. Los Angeles enacted a law soon after. More than fifteen years later, other US cities including Portland, Oregon, and Berkeley, California, as well as the State of Hawaii, have enacted similar initiatives. And in November 2014, Louisville, Kentucky, passed a CEDAW resolution. Local government are being asked to ratify CEDAW ordinances with all the mechanisms of gender analysis and an oversight task force comprising civil society.

Other cities throughout the United States are also working toward gaining public support for enacting CEDAW initiatives. What these new laws offer at the municipal level is a set of guidelines reflecting an international consensus to eliminate gender discrimination that is embodied in CEDAW.

NGO CSW/NY

The NGO Committee on the Status of Women, NY (NGO CSW/NY), supports the work of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women and UN Women. NGO CSW/NY is an untiring advocate with Member States for gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls across the globe in support of the work of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women and UN Women. NGO CSW/NY supports the implementation of the 1995 Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, UN Security Resolution 1325, the UN Millennium Development Goals and the Convention to Eliminate All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

NGO CSW/NY represents more than 100 member organizations and individuals concerned about the status of women and girls. Events at the UN headquarters in New York are monitored on a daily basis with daily participation.

Every year in New York, NGO CSW/NY organizes NGO Consultation Day in preparation for the session on the UN Commission on the Status of Women that takes place in February/March for two weeks. Activists gather from around the world to discuss issues pertaining to women and girls, to network, share strategies/best practices and to lobby governments to implement resolutions and treaties that they have signed. NGO Representative are brought together to caucus, issue joint statements and provide wording for the Agreed Conclusions of the annual United Nations Commission on the Status of Women.

NGO CSW/NY participants at CSW meetings conduct trainings and orientation for NGO representatives, and run an international listserv that continuously conveys emails and keeps women worldwide apprised of issues throughout the world on gender inequality issues.

- · Monthly meetings featuring UN and government speakers;
- Facilitation of NGO participation at CSW meetings;
- Promotion of a gender perspective at the UN and other international meetings;

• An annual "Woman of Distinction Award" to recognize a woman for her leadership in the struggle for gender equality and women's empowerment;

 Maintenance of websites and communication via social media (Facebook, Twitter, Mail Chimp); and

• An intern program.

CSW 60 BUREAU AND CONSTITUENTS

The Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), a functional commission of the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), is a global policy-making body dedicated exclusively to promoting gender equality and the empowerment of women. The Commission was established by an ECOSOC resolution in 1946 with a mandate to prepare recommendations on promoting women's rights in the political, economic, civil, social and educational fields. The Commission also makes recommendations to the Council on urgent problems requiring immediate attention in the field of women's rights.

The Bureau for the 60th session (2016) comprises the following members:

The CSW comprises 45 members elected by the Economic and Social Council for a period of four years. Members, who are appointed by governments, are elected on the following basis: 13 from African states, 11 from Asian states, 4 from Eastern European states, 9 from Latin American and Caribbean states, and 8 from Western European and other states.

UN WOMEN

In July 2010, the United Nations General Assembly created UN Women, the UN Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women. In doing so, UN Member States took an historic step in accelerating the Organization's goals on gender equality and the empowerment of women. The creation of UN Women came about as part of the UN reform agenda, bringing together resources and mandates for greater impact.

UN Women became fully operational on 1 January 2011. It is headed by an Under-Secretary-General (USG) as the executive director. The current executive director is Phumzile Mlambo-Ngcuka, former Deputy President of South Africa, who took the oath of office on 19 August 2013. She was preceded by Michelle Bachelet of Chile.

UN Women supports UN Member States as they set global standards for achieving gender equality, and works with governments and civil society to design laws, policies, programs and services needed to implement these standards. It stands behind women's equal participation in all aspects of life, focusing on five priority areas:

- Increasing women's leadership and participation;
- Ending violence against women and girls;
- Engaging women in all aspects of peace and security processes;
- Enhancing women's economic empowerment; and
- Making gender equality central to national development planning and budgeting

UN Women also coordinates and promotes the UN system's work in enhancing gender equality work. Its main roles are:

- To support intergovernmental bodies, such as the CSW, in their formulation of policies, global standards and norms.
- To help Member States to implement these standards, standing ready to provide suitable technical and financial support to those countries that request it, and to forge effective partnerships with civil society.

WORLD CONFERENCES ON WOMEN

1975 Mexico City

The first UN World Conference on Women coincided with the International Women's Year and served to remind the international community that discrimination against women continued to be a persistent problem in much of the world. The following goals were established:

- Full gender equality and the elimination of gender discrimination;
- · The integration and full participation of women in development;
- An increased contribution by women in the strengthening of world peace.

A World Plan of Action was adopted offering guidelines for governments and the international community over the next ten years to accomplish the three key objectives set by the GA. The Plan of Action set minimum targets, to be met by 1980, focusing on securing equal access for women to resources including education, employment opportunities, political participation, health services, housing, nutrition and family planning.

1980 Copenhagen

At the second UN World Conference on Women, it was determined that there was a discrepancy between universal legal rights and women's ability to exercise these rights.

Among the barriers were:

- · Insufficient involvement of men;
- · Too few women in decision-making positions;
- Lack of financial resources;
- · Insufficient political will;
- Too few day-care centers and credit facilities to support women.

1985 Nairobi

The Third UN World Conference on Women sought to assess the achievements of the United Nations Decade for Women. Although the Women's Movement had now become an international force unified under the banner of the "Decade for Women: Equality, Development and Peace", delegates were confronted with shocking reports. Data gathered by the United Nations revealed that improvements in the status of women and efforts to reduce discrimination had benefited only a small minority of women. Improvements in the situation of women in the developing world had been marginal at best. The Nairobi Forward-Looking Strategies (NFLS) to the Year 2000 was a blueprint for improving the condition of women. It broke new ground as it declared all issues to be women's issues. Women's participation in decision making and the handling of all human affairs was recognized as a legitimate right and social and political necessity.

1995 Beijing

A fundamental transformation took place at the Beijing Fourth World Conference on Women. This was the recognition, based on the Vienna Conference on Human Rights, that women's rights are human rights. There must be a shift of focus from "women" to the concept of "gender", recognizing that the entire structure of society and all relations between men and women within it had to be re-evaluated.

The Beijing Conference unanimously adopted the Beijing Declaration and Beijing Platform for Action (BPfA) which was, in essence, an agenda for women's empowerment. The BPfA is a milestone in the advancement of women. It specified twelve critical areas of concern: Women and poverty, Education and training of women, Women and health, Violence against women, Women and armed conflict, Women and the economy, Women in power and decision making, Institutional mechanism for the advancement of women, Human rights of women, Women and the media, Women and the environment, and the Girl-child.

REVIEW CONFERENCES ON BPFA

2000 Beijing plus Five (B+5)

The Twenty-third Special Session of the General Assembly (23rd SSGA) produced an outcome document which listed the achievements in the advancement of women during the previous five years. It identified obstacles and current challenges to the process and strengthened the BPfA by focusing action and addressing new issues.

2005 Beijing plus Ten (B+10)

CSW 49 was a celebratory review of the implementation of the BPfA and the outcome document of the 23rd SSGA. It also looked at the current challenges and forward-looking strategies since the SSGA.

2010 Beijing plus Fifteen (B+15)

CSW 54 presented a fifteen-year review of the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and BPfA and the outcomes of the 23rd SSGA. Emphasis was placed on the sharing of experiences and good practices, with a view to overcoming remaining obstacles and new challenges, including those related to the MDGs. On 2 March 2010 the CSW adopted a Declaration reaffirming the BPfA and the outcomes of the 23rd SSGA, calling for their full and effective implementation, and emphasizing that such implementation is essential to the achievement of the MDGs.

2015 Beijing plus Twenty (B+20)

CSW 59 provided an opportunity for attendees to participate in a twenty-year review of the progress made in implementing the Beijing Declaration and the resulting Beijing Platform for Action (BPfA). An Outcome Document was not produced at the conclusion of CSW59. Instead, a Political Declaration was negotiated by Member States in which Ministers and Heads of States agreed to further commit to the implementation of the BPfA.

Included in the declaration were commitments to: the reinforcement of gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls in the realization of their human rights; the integration of a gender perspective in the intergovernmental negotiations and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs); the mobilization of civil society, the private sector and other stakeholders at all levels in the full, effective and accelerated implementation of the BPfA, through the mobilization of resources and the use of data and accountability systems to monitor progress; supporting and encouraging civil society, including men and boys in the advancement and promotion of gender; significantly increasing resources to promote gender equality; and strengthening accountability for the implementation of existing commitments.

Additionally, a document "Future Organization and Methods of Work of the Commission on the Status of Women" which details the future working methods between Member States and NGOs was introduced.




