



CHAIR'S WELCOME BY DR. SUSAN O'MALLEY

Never have the voices and activism of women in civil society been more important than they are today in this unsettled world of conflict and increasing disparity between the rich and poor. And never has the mantra of "Leave no one Behind" been more critical to implement the SDGs and the Agenda 2030.

The Priority Theme for CSW62, "Challenges and opportunities in achieving gender equality and the empowerment of rural women and girls", is central to understand "Leave no one behind", for rural women and girls, including widows both young and old, rural women and girls with disabilities and those who are HIV-positive are often those who are most left behind. The last time Rural Women was the subject of the priority theme in CSW56, there was no Outcome Document. One of the reasons was the voices of rural women were not heard; others spoke for them. At CSW62 we intend to rectify that.

We began the process in September 2017 by forming a study group both face-to-face, on-line and on conference calls to educate us on the concerns of rural women. We read the UN Women's Expert Group Papers and the U.N. Secretary General's Report on rural women and held a meeting at which rural women from Kenya, Trinidad and Tobago, and upstate New York spoke to us about their concerns in their CSW62 statements, video clips and in person. We concluded that the concerns of rural women in both the global north and global south must be heard and addressed as stated in the SDGs.

Subgroups within our newly named Subcommittee on the CSW62 Zero Draft formed around human rights; gender based violence including migrants; health and sanitation; education, employment and technology; and land rights and climate change. Each group contributed facts, recommendations and best practices to our document entitled 'Systemic Barriers, Sustainable Development and the Diversity of Rural Women and Girls" that has been circulated widely and is on our website. The next step, understanding already agreed-upon UN language for each of our issues, was facilitated for us by a lawyer and a civil society member who for many years has been part of her country's CSW delegation. Armed with this knowledge and preparation, we will work together to amplify the voices of rural women in the Outcome Document.

Reflective of the CSW62 Review Theme, "Participation and access of women to the media, and information and communication technologies and their impact on and use as an instrument for the advancement and empowerment of women and girls", the afternoon of Consultation Day with the help of PCI Media Impact will focus on using rural women's stories to create change, inspiration, energy and know how featuring 4 rural women from 4 different regions, using 4 different media on 4 different issues. There will also be a focus on how to use media for capacity building.

NGOCSW/NY will also partner with Sean Southey, CEO of PCI Media Impact, to create a Media Zone on March 14 in the CCUN that will feature rural women around the world telling their stories that will be amplified by the Pvblic Foundation on social media, on-line and in print journalism. Now Her, a social media platform, will also be working with us to ensure that the voices of rural women at CSW62 are heard.

I wish you a productive and energizing two weeks at CSW62 in moving forward the concerns of rural women and girls within a human rights perspective in the global south and north.

Summary

A seminal moment in recognizing the important role of women in society was the founding of the Commission on the Status of Women. From its inception, the Commission has championed the rights of women. The rallying cry has been "Human Rights are Women's Rights and Women's Rights are Human Rights". Through the work of the Commission the international community has ratified and enacted many laws or conventions to protect women and achieve full human rights. Some of the outcomes highlighted below are the results of years of setting standards and formulating international conventions to change discriminatory legislation and foster global awareness of women's issues. These subjects described herein are at the heart of the work of not only NGO CSW/NY, but all NGO CSWs around the globe.

CEDAW (Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women) moves into the 21st Century

Women want the freedom to live their lives free from negatives like gender-discrimination, gender-based violence, sex trafficking and domestic emotional and physical abuse. They want to be able to equitably reach their potential without employment and pay discrimination and to have equal access to appropriate healthcare and education. Societies, through governments, must support and nurture the basic rights of all their residents, including women.

Cultures are diverse and define personal relationships in many ways. Countries have come together and negotiated a universal standard that defines gender discrimination. Upon accepting this universal standard, individual societies can no longer say that gender discrimination is a foreign concept.

CEDAW (the Convention on the Elimination of All forms of Discrimination Against Women) is an international treaty negotiated and ratified by 189 out of 193 countries in the world and adopted in 1979 by the United Nations General Assembly. CEDAW defines what constitutes discrimination against women and sets an international agenda for national action to end such discrimination. The convention addresses the five major tenets of human rights: economic, political, civil, cultural and social rights for women and girls; it calls for equal education, employment and training opportunities, while promoting social benefits, including social security, pensions, disability payments, health care, maternity benefits, parental leave and child and elderly care.

CEDAW also defines a structure for nations to report their progress in eliminating discrimination against women. It sets up a system of quadrennial

national reports from governments to the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), outlining their progress and challenges. Organizations outside of government have the opportunity to submit shadow reports.

Historically, treaties define external relationships between nations. CEDAW, and other human rights conventions, however, relate to internal relationships between people. Many nations have had structural difficulties in translating these rights from central governments to local municipalities that interact daily with the people. This has driven the need for a new paradigm for enforcing women's rights at a local level: Cities for CEDAW.

Cities for CEDAW Campaign is a grassroots initiative to encourage local governments in the United States to support gender rights by adopting local ordinances based on the CEDAW principles. It provides the tools to enable local governments to assess their actions through a gender lens.

Nine cities across the United States have adopted full ordinances led by San Francisco, California in 1998, followed by Los Angeles, California; Miami-Dade County, Florida; Cincinnati, Ohio; Honolulu, Hawaii; Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; San Jose, California, Berkeley, California and Santa Clara County, California. Los Angeles is taking the lead in implementation; a Mayoral Executive Order requires all 38 budgeted departments to have an operational plan headed by a representative who reports monthly to the Mayor. There are 26 cities or counties with strong Resolutions moving toward Ordinances and 31 more cities exploring Resolutions and Ordinances.

Local municipalities are being asked to pass CEDAW ordinances with all the mechanisms of gender analysis, an oversight body from civil society, and to allocate appropriate funding. The Cities for CEDAW initiative aims to bring together the people and communities of a nation and lay the groundwork for this new paradigm shift to gender equity.

Beijing Declaration

The landmark Fourth World Conference on Women held in Beijing in 1995 was attended by governments, the UN and other stakeholders. Thirty thousand women and 17,000 activists from around the world participated, and they demanded and achieved a commitment that member states would "ensure the full enjoyment by women and the girl child of all human rights and fundamental freedoms, and take effective action against violations of these rights and freedoms". Hillary Clinton's pronouncement that "Women's rights are human rights" was included in the Declaration. The declaration has served as a road map for achieving gender equality.

Beijing Platform for Action

The Beijing Platform for Action (BPfA) was adopted at the Fourth World Conference. It is the strongest document in the UN on gender equality and women's human rights to date. BPfA reaffirms that all human rights-civil, cultural, economic, political and social, including the right to development – are universal, indivisible, and interdependent and interrelated. The full and equal enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms by women and girls must be a priority for Governments and the United Nations and is essential for the advancement of women. Critical areas for implementation by governments to ensure positive outcomes for women in all areas of society outlined by BPfA are: 1) Women and poverty, 2) Education and training of women, 3) Women and health, 4) Violence against women, 5) Women and armed conflict, 6) Women and the economy, 7) Women in power and decision making, 8) Existing institutional mechanisms, 9) Human rights of women (e.g. implementing UN instruments and laws and policies, including CEDAW), 10) Women and the media,11) Women and the environment, 12) The girl child.

The most recent review of BPfA, held in 2015 with UN Women participating, indicated that many challenges remain. A "Call to Action" was adopted to ensure full implementation in its current form by its 25th anniversary in 2020. UN Women and CSW will work on a resolution to commemorate the anniversary.

CSW62 will address the many issues still impacting rural women and girls including discrimination, humiliating poverty, climate change and inadequate access to education, financial services and health care.

UN Security Resolution 1325 (UN/SCR1325) Women, Peace, and Security

Peace often does not last beyond the peace negotiation process and the symbolic endorsement of signatories. Conflict resolution begins when all concerned parties, including leaders of warring factions, governments, the United Nations and civil society are brought together in an effort to end all hostilities and develop a roadmap for a path to reconciliation and nation building. Warring factions often see negotiations as a strategic means of regrouping before continuing hostilities and a delay tactic allowing warlords to ignore negotiated peace accords. Civilians are often the victims of these armed conflicts; and women and children, in particular, bear the brunt of the atrocities identified with conflicts. Yet women are regularly not included in negotiations or ensuring that commitments are implemented and respected.

The United Nations sought to address this problem by acknowledging that women are integral to any peace process by passing Security Council Resolution 1325 on women, peace and security on 31 October 2000. UNSC/R1325 was negotiated with the understanding that for peace to be sustainable, women must be included in peace negotiations. It reaffirms the important role of women in the peace negotiation process, prevention of conflict, peacebuilding, peacekeeping, and humanitarian responses. It recognizes and cements the importance and the role of women's equal participation and full involvement in all United Nations peace and security efforts.

Rebel factions see rape as a legitimate weapon of war, intending to fracture not only the victims but also the wider society. The effects of rape are not restricted to those attacked but have a ripple effect that impacts families, communities, towns and peoples.

Boys are not the only ones kidnapped and forcibly conscripted in armed conflicts. Girls, too, are forcibly conscripted, not only as porters and "war brides," but also as child combatants. Yet, there were no provisions in the UN disarmament processes recognizing girls' roles.

Where then are the women in peace negotiations – women who make up over half the population in a war-torn society; women who bear the brunt of keeping their families alive while coping with the trauma of extreme physical and mental violations; girls that need to be recognized as forced combatants?

Resolution 1325 has changed the way the international community thinks about peace and security. The "Women and War" Conference, held November 3-5, 2010 by United States Institute of Peace (USIP) and its partners, specifically highlighted the importance of Resolution 1325 through its impact on international law, women's empowerment, the military, and global security.

Because of this Resolution, more women have been included in peace talks, and UN-troop-contributing countries are mandated to include more women in their troops. As long as member-states adhere to the Resolution 1325, women will be included in the decision-making for peace and security at every level of society.

This is why UNSC/R1325 on Women, Peace and Security is so critical for basic human rights and enshrined in these five pillars:

 Increased participation and representation of women at all levels of decision-making

- Attention to specific protection needs of women and girls in conflict
- Gender perspective in post-conflict processes
- Gender perspective in UN programming, reporting, and in Security Council missions
- Gender perspective and training in UN peace support operations

2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development: 17 GOALS TO TRANSFORM OUR WORLD

On 25 September 2015 at an historic United Nations Summit, the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) were adopted by world leaders as a call to action by all countries to improve the lives of all people globally. The SDGs build on the UN Millennium Development Goals that were set up in 2000 to eradicate poverty, hunger, illiteracy and disease. The SDGs are designed to end all forms of poverty and inequalities and to protect the earth and its inhabitants. The UN is working with governments and civil society to achieve the SDGs by 2030 in order to ensure that no one is left behind.

Unlike the MDGs, both the Global North and Global South have been called to implement the SDGs by promoting prosperity, realizing the human rights of all and protecting the planet. Of particular concern for NGO CSW is SDG 5 on Gender Equality. Although the SDGs are not legally binding, governments are expected to take ownership, establish national frameworks to achieve the 17 SDG Goals and report at least once on their progress at the High Level Political Forum (HLPF), which is held every July at the UN. The dates for the HLPF in 2018 are 9-18 July. Further information about the SDGs is available online at sustainabledevelopment.un.org.



Commission on the Status of Women (CSW)

CSW62 Bureau and Constituents

The Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), a functional commission of the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), is a global policy-making body dedicated exclusively to promoting gender equality and the empowerment of women. The Commission was established by an ECOSOC resolution in 1946 with a mandate to prepare recommendations on promoting women's rights in the political, economic, civil, social and educational fields. The Commission also makes recommendations to the Council on urgent problems requiring immediate attention in the field of women's rights.

The Bureau of the Commission plays a crucial role in facilitating the preparation for, and in ensuring the successful outcome of the annual sessions of the Commission. Bureau members serve for two years.

The members of the Bureau for the 62nd session (2018) of the Commission on the Status of Women are:

The CSW is constituted of 45 members elected by the Economic and Social Council for a period of four years. Members, who are appointed by governments, are elected on the following basis: 13 from African states, 11 from Asian States, 4 from Eastern Europe states, 9 from Latin American and Caribbean states, and 8 from Western European and other states.

United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN Women)

The General Assembly created UN Women in 2010 to accelerate gender equality and empowerment of women. Four former parts of the UN system, Division for the Advancement of Women (DAW), International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women (INSTRAW), Office of the Special Adviser on Gender Issues and Advancement of Women (OSAGI), and United Nations Development Fund for Women (UNIFEM), which had all focused exclusively on gender equality and women's empowerment, merged to form UN Women – United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women. This consolidation into one organization has greater impact.

The main roles of UN Women are:

- To support inter-governmental bodies, such as the Commission on the Status of Women, in its formulation of policies, global standards and norms;
- To help Member States to implement these standards, standing ready to provide suitable technical and financial support to those countries that request it, and to forge effective partnerships with civil society;
- To lead and coordinate the UN system's work on gender equality as well as promote accountability, including regular monitoring of systemwide progress.

UN Women is the Secretariat of the Commission on the Status of Women. The Executive Director is Under-Secretary-General Phumzile Mlambo-Ngcuka. She and her team work collaboratively with Member States, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), other UN agencies, academia and the private sector to advance these priority areas:

Increasing women's leadership and participation;

- Ending violence against women and girls;
- Engaging women in all aspects of peace and security processes;
- Enhancing women's economic empowerment; and
- Making gender equality central to national development planning and budgeting.

On March 14, 2018, UN Women launched its flagship report, "Turning promises into action: Gender Equality in the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development". The report demonstrates through concrete evidence and data the pervasive nature of discrimination against all women and girls everywhere, and puts forth actionable recommendations on how to fulfil the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Here are some of the daunting statistics on gender equality (SDG 5):

- In 18 countries, husbands can legally prevent their wives from working
- In 39 countries, daughters and sons do not have equal inheritance rights
- 49 countries lack laws protecting women from domestic violence
- 19% of women and girls aged 19 to 49 have experienced physical and/ or sexual violence by an intimate partner in the past 12 months
- Globally, 750 million women and girls were married before the age of 18

LEAVING NO ONE BEHIND: EMPOWERING RURAL WOMEN AND GIRLS

Civil society's involvement in the 62nd session of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) provides an opportunity to galvanize critical advocacy and action around its priority theme: 'challenges and opportunities in achieving gender equality and the empowerment of rural women and girls'.

Gender and geographic inequalities mean that rural women and girls are disproportionately affected by poverty, exclusion and the effects of environmental and climate change. Rural women often work in low-paid, informal jobs with poor conditions and limited access to social protection, and their rights to land may be compromised by inadequate legal and policy frameworks, ineffective implementation, and discriminatory gender norms. A lack of infrastructure limits women's and girls' access to clean drinking water and safe sanitation facilities, while their distance from health services contributes to high rates of maternal death and poor reproductive and sexual health. Evidence also shows that harmful practices such as child marriage and FGM may be more prevalent in rural areas. These conditions are exacerbated by rural women's and girls' limited access to effective legal, judicial and institutional remedies.

Yet, we have ways to meet these challenges head-on. This year, the CSW review theme focuses on using media and information and communication technologies (ICTs) to advance and empower women and girls. When used by rural women and girls, technology is a powerful development tool and one of the greatest vehicles for change. Technology can bring women the chance to improve their livelihoods and to participate in ICT-enabled mobile learning, where they might otherwise not be able to access outside employment due to security concerns, remote location or cultural restrictions. It can help farmers adopt new agricultural methods and monitor markets. For example, in Rwanda UN Women's 'Buy from Women' project has used mobile technology to connect some 3,500 women farmers to information, markets and finance. And in Kenya, the mobile phone platform M-Pesa is helping to reach the unbanked and to bring women into the formal economy. Technology can also be a critical tool to connect and mobilize survivors of gender-based violence in rural areas where services are scarce.

In order to capitalize on these opportunities, we need to work together to bridge the global gender digital divide. Right now, some 3.9 billion people remain offline – and they are predominantly rural, poorer, less educated and female. Infrastructure and technology tend to reach rural women and girls last, and low literacy and numeracy rates combined with economic, social and cultural barriers can make it difficult for poor rural women to access and operate mobile phones. However, we are also seeing progress, thanks to rapidly declining costs of renewable energy technologies and decentralized sustainable energy solutions, which have already begun benefiting rural women and girls.

The CSW provides a critical opportunity to advocate for greater investment in gender-responsive rural infrastructure and technology, the eradication of poverty, quality education, the achievement of universal health coverage, the elimination of harmful practices and the fulfilment of women's rights to adequate nutrition and land. UN Women's partnership with civil society is essential to our success in achieving all of these ambitions, so that no one is left behind.



The NGO Committee on the Status of Women, NY (NGO CSW/NY)

The NGO Committee on the Status of Women, NY (NGO CSW/NY) supports the work of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) and UN Women. NGO CSW/NY is an untiring advocate with Member States for gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls across the globe in support of the work of United Nations Commission on the Status of Women and UN Women. NGO CSW/NY supports the implementation of the 1995 Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, UN Security Resolution 1325, the Convention to Eliminate All Forms of Discrimination Against Women and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

NGO CSW/NY represents more than 100 member organizations and individuals concerned about the status of women and girls. Events at UN headquarters in New York are monitored on a daily basis with daily participation.

Every year in New York, NGO CSW/NY organizes NGO Consultation Day in preparation for the session on the UN Commission on the Status of Women that now takes place in March for two weeks. Activists gather from around the world to discuss issues pertaining to women and girls, to network, share strategies/best practices and to lobby governments to implement resolutions and treaties that they have signed. NGO representatives are brought together to caucus, issue joint statements and provide wording for the Agreed Conclusions of the annual United Nations Commission on the Status of Women. For CSW62, NGO CSW/NY prepared a Zero Draft Document to amplify the voices of rural women and girls in the Outcome Document.

NGO CSW/NY participates at CSW meetings by conducting trainings and orientation for NGO representatives and, through its vast networks, keeps women worldwide apprised of gender-based issues. Monthly meetings feature UN and government speakers. Foremost, NGO CSW/NY promotes "women's rights are human rights" at the UN and other international meetings.

Technology and Media in the Empowerment of Rural Women and Girls

Section J of the Beijing Platform for Action specifically states, "Self-regulatory mechanisms for the media need to be created and strengthened and approaches developed to eliminate gender-biased programming. . .Women therefore need to be involved in decision-making regarding the development of the new technologies in order to participate fully in their growth and impact." Although some rural women have been able to secure leadership

positions in their respective fields, many still do not possess the power to influence decisions at the local, national and international levels, especially in the media and communications sector.

In addition to increased access to decision-making, all women - especially rural women - will benefit from increased gender sensitivity in media and communications. The lack of gender sensitivity in the media has also been fueled by gender stereotypes that marginalize women as technophobic and lacking technical capabilities. Rural women are oftentimes left behind due to the lack of inclusive policies that address their issues and concerns. The level of media accessibility and use by rural women must increase because media plays a significantly critical role in the improvement of their welfare. Additionally, media literacy acts as a powerful tool in eradicating roots of gender stereotyping, transforming traditional gender ideologies, dismantling patriarchal structures and achieving gender equality.

Male-dominated industries and sectors have also been suppressing and ignoring not only the needs of rural women but also women in general. Media should portray women as change-makers, rather than being occupied with dialogues that overemphasize women as victims and perpetrators.

In order to eliminate gender-based stereotyping in media, women must have a seat at the decision-making table at media organizations. According to statistics from UN Women, "Globally only 27% of top management jobs in media organizations are held by women, only 21% of filmmakers are women and only 23% of films feature a woman protagonist." These statistics, however, overlook the urban-rural divide and what it means to rural women. The lack of women's representation, gender stereotypes and women's role that is portrayed in the media can greatly impact rural women and girls. Since women in rural areas remain more susceptible to violence instigated by male-dominated societies, they face significant barriers in making their voices heard through media. Access to media literacy and to digital platforms, community media, will make a tremendous impact on improving the lives of rural women in girls and certainly enhance a country's economic gains.

New pathways for women include those found through online media. In addition to the need for women in top management jobs in media organizations, women should have more access to technology sector jobs

that are leading the way in the future of work worldwide and because of the lack of access to the internet, are leaving rural women behind.

"The global Internet user gender gap grew from 11% in 2013 to 12% in 2016. The gap remains large in the world's Least Developed Countries (LDCs) — at 31%. In 2016, the regional gender gap is largest in Africa (23%) and smallest in the Americas (2%)" - International Telecommunications Unions, ICT Facts and Figures 2016.

Online media connects the fundamental societal pillars of science, education, and culture. Social media and internet technology accounts for a growing area of influence in every field, and especially in the way the world digests the news, perceives information and in the way the world creates and dispenses revenue. In order to achieve gender parity, the information gap for rural women must be eliminated, in part, by increasing access to internet connectivity and developing more women in technology-related jobs. Rural women are also left behind in areas that lack access to digital communications via mobile phones, a key device in especially the least developed nations that aid in everyday business, communications, and economic empowerment.

Improving access for rural women in communications and information technology will also improve access to economic empowerment for rural communities




PARALLEL EVENTS GUIDELINES



Thousands of girls and women are contracting HIV every day – because they're not able to choose what happens to their bodies. If we're to end the HIV epidemic, we must end gender inequality.




In sub-Saharan Africa, gender-based violence is fuelling a sharp rise in HIV among adolescent girls and young women aged 10 to 24.

Those who are raped, abused or forced into relationships or marriage are three times more likely to get HIV. The risk doubles for those who experience violence at the hands of their partner. In many cases, a girl's first sexual experience will not happen by choice.




